

Spring BOGO Book Fair



What are they up to?

On Thursday April 20th, 6th Graders participated in a Christian Seder. The Passover Seder is an elaborate teaching experience intended to call people to their identity as the People of God. By using all of the senses, the Passover Seder tells the story of God's grace in history and calls the participants to experience and share in the story as their own story. 6th Graders studied and learned the stories of the Exodus within their curriculum this year. They enjoyed the Seder experience as they were reminded of the faith of the Israelites. The Christian Seder is presented as a way for people of Christian Faith to express symbolically the story of salvation while preserving the spirit of the Jewish traditions to respect the faith journey of Israelites and Jews across the centuries (Christian Research Institute).

- ✓ Did you know that you can earn 2.25 hours towards your service hour requirement for each day that you help?

The cafeteria is in need of parent and/or grandparent volunteers to assist with monitoring during each lunch period. We ask that you arrive by 10:45 Monday-Thursday, and stay through our last lunch period ends at 1:00. Friday's arrival time is 11:00 due to the children attending Mass in the morning, but lunch still ends at 1:00.

Volunteering couldn't be easier! As a volunteer lunch monitor, you will simply need to walk around the lunch room and assist the children as needed (opening milk cartons, go-gurts, etc) as well as making sure that they are safe (no running, sharing food, etc.).

In the warmer months and even as it cools down, the children love to be outside! We need at least 3-4 volunteers to ensure the safety of the children as they run around in the fresh air. During the winter months, we will remain inside and use the Gym and/or Parish Center when they are available. Again, having 3-4 volunteers, even while inside, is a necessary precaution to ensure safety.
