What are they up to?

For the 3rd year in a row, our 7th graders hand made rosaries (in religion class) for our 3rd graders in honor of their First Communion. 

The Book Swap

On Thursday, May 18th and Friday, May 19th, during lunch periods, Mrs. Wojcik and Mrs. Gasiecki will host another book swap! Students can bring gently used books from home they are finished with to "swap" for new books. We hope to encourage reading at home, without costing families any money!

How it works:

• This will be a two day process. Day 1: students bring in their books and get a ticket for each book they turn in. Day 2: students exchange each ticket for one book.



Books <u>must</u> be grade level appropriate!

K-1: books with pictures

2-5: at least one book must be a grade appropriate chapter book

- Grades 2+ will have to show responsibility by keeping track of their tickets. We will track grades K and 1.
- Students may "swap" up to 3 books. Books need to be "like new" condition, but not brand new. Books with torn or missing pages will not be accepted.
- We kindly ask parents <u>not</u> to come to help your children pick out books, as we want them to make their own choices (we will monitor this, of course[®]).

Our next swap will start on Thursday, May 18th.

We hope you will encourage your students to participate!

Unfortunately, due to previous lack of participation, middle school will not be included in this swap.
