
#### School Photo

On Thursday May 24th our 7th Grade Students enjoyed a day at Corning Museum of Glass. They even had a chance to create a masterpiece of their own!





# The Book Swap

The book swap is back! A few times throughout the year, Mrs. Wojcik and Mrs. Gasiecki will host a book swap for students in **grades K-5**. Students can bring gently used books from home they are finished with to "swap" for new books. We hope to encourage reading at home, without costing families any money!

#### How it works:

• This will be a two day process. Day 1: students bring in their books and get a ticket for each book they turn in. Day 2: students exchange each ticket for one book.



Books must be grade level appropriate!

K-1: books with pictures & simple words

2-5: at least one book must be a grade appropriate chapter book

- Notifications of the dates will be posted in the newsletter.
- Grades 2+ will have to show responsibility by keeping track of their tickets. We will track grades K and 1.
- Students may "swap" up to 3 books. Books need to be "like new" condition, but not brand new. Books with torn or missing pages will not be accepted.
- We kindly ask parents <u>not</u> to come to help your children pick out books, as we want them to make their own choices (we will monitor this, of course ©).

Our book swap will start on Tuesday, June 6th.
