SPORTS REPORT

It's time to sign up for a Spring sport! If your child is interested in playing a Spring sport they must get a sign up form from the school nurse during their lunch period. Deadline for ALL sign ups are due no later than Wed. Feb. 28th.

Spring sports are as follows:



Boys volleyball- grades 5th-8th Co-ed soccer- grades 1st-8th Go-ed track- grades 3rd-8th





Your child may sign up for track AND another spring sport if they are interested. However, please note that there may be some conflicts playing 2 sports in 1 season.

Athletic fee is \$40.00 per athlete for volleyball, softball & soccer. The track fee is only \$20.00 per athlete.

Each athlete needs to have their OWN sign up form for the sport they wish to play, please do not add siblings onto 1 form. If your child is signing up for more than 1 sport, they need separate sign up forms for each sport. However, 1 check may be written for the total for a student playing multiple sports. One check is per family is also ok if there are multiple family members playing. (Ex. if a family has 2 children playing soccer and 1 playing volleyball and 1 member doing track, 1 check would be made payable to: St. Mary's elementary school for a total of \$140.00.)

Boys volleyball and Girls softball JV/Varsity Roster Info: Varsity = Grades 7 & 8 JV = 5 & 6 Adjustments to the varsity roster would only happen should there be a shortage of 7/8 students to fill the team; in which case 6th graders may be included. In the event the varsity roster is filled appropriately, 6th graders are not placed on a varsity team. In the event that there is not enough interest to form a JV team, there is simply not a JV team this season.

"FUN DRESS DAYS" to raise money for CATHOLIC CHARITIES



- <u>TUESDAY, MARCH 20, 2018</u> Dress Down Day for \$1.00. Jeans are allowed but must not have tears or holes in them.




SME February Freeze JV Girls



Regarding: Peanut and Tree Nut Free Snacks

Please remember that St. Mary's Elementary school has a strict policy regarding snacks and treats in the classroom. For the safety of all students here, all snacks and treats, which will be eaten in the classroom, brought in from home must be PEANUT AND TREE NUT FREE.

Please be aware of advisory labels stating that a food item that "may have been manufactured in a facility that may contain peanuts/tree nuts" are also not safe.

We have numerous students here with severe life threatening allergies-please do your part to help keep them safe. I understand that checking food labels or finding a certain treat may be difficult and time consuming but this is what a parent/guardian of a food allergic child does numerous times throughout the day. Food labels are constantly changing; a once safe item may not be now...please check the label every time. We want all students here to feel safe and have fun during class parties. Please remember there are other ways to celebrate birthdays and holidays with non-food options.

All treats brought in for parties must be checked prior to entering the classroom. Please remind your child to stop in the main office with their food item before going to the classroom in the morning.

Did you know that 1 in 13 kids in the United States has a food allergy? That's about two kids in every classroom. For kids with food allergies, even a tiny amount of the food they are allergic to can make them very sick.

The most common food allergies are to milk, egg, peanuts, tree nuts (like walnuts and almonds), soy, wheat, fish, and shellfish (like shrimp and crab). But a person can be allergic to any food!

Since food allergies affect so many kids, it is good to learn how you can Be a PAL® to a friend with food allergies! Here's how:



Know that food allergies are very serious.

It's hard to believe that foods you eat every day can hurt others, but it's true!

If someone with a food allergy eats something they are allergic to, they can get very sick and sometimes have to go to the hospital.

If a friend or classmate has a food allergy, don't tease, bully or make fun of them. Tell an adult right away if you see other kids picking on someone with a food allergy,



Don't share your food with friends who have food allergies.

You can share jokes and laughs with your friends with food allergies, but don't share food. For kids with food allergies, sharing food can be very dangerous. So don't offer kids with food allergies anything from your lunch or snack. Why? Because it may have something in it that could make them very sick or hurt them.

Wash hands after eating.

Washing your hands with soap and water after you eat is very important. It's a good way to clean off any food that is on your hands.

Help all of your friends and classmates have fun together!

There are lots of ways to have fun without food! Listening to music, playing board or video games, making crafts, going for a bike ride, and playing sports are just some of the cool things you can do together. This way, everyone stays safe and has fun!

If a friend with food allergies feels sick, get help right away!

If your friend feels sick or thinks they may have eaten something they are allergic to, tell an adult right away or dial 911! They will make sure your friend gets help and gets the medicine they need to feel better.

The announcement that Jesus makes as he begins his preaching in today's Gospel is recalled on Ash Wednesday at the signing with ashes: "Repent and believe in the gospel." This is our challenge for Lent; indeed, it is the challenge of our entire life. During Lent, we are invited to strengthen and to renew the promises that we made at our Baptism, to reject Satan and sin so as to live as children of God. Through the grace of God that we received at Baptism, we follow the promptings of the Holy Spirit and know that with Jesus' help, we will be victorious over sin.

As you gather as a family, talk about the importance of Baptism. At our Baptism, our sins were forgiven, and we promised to live as children of God. As part of the Rite of Baptism, we rejected sin and Satan. Read today's Gospel, Mark 1:12-15. During Lent, we renew the promises of our Baptism, turning again from sin and promising to follow God. Light a candle, perhaps a candle used at one of your family member's Baptisms, and pray together the Act of Contrition.

Act of Contrition

Oh my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you, and I detest all my sins because of your just punishments, but most of all because they offend you, my God, who are all-good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of your grace to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin. Amen.
