SPORTS REPORT

Spring sign up forms were DUE TODAY! However, because of how the winter break fell, your child may still sign up by this Friday, March 2nd! Your child will need to see the school nurse tomorrow to get a registration form and the form with payment must be sent to school on Friday.

Spring sports are as follows:

Boys volleyball- grades 5th-8th

Girls softball- grades 5th- 8th Co-ed soccer- grades 1st-8th

Co-ed track- grades 3rd-8th Your child may sign up for track AND another spring sport if they are interested. However, please note that there may be some conflicts playing 2 sports in 1 season.

Athletic fee is \$40.00 per athlete for volleyball, softball & soccer. The track fee is only \$20.00 per athlete.

Each athlete needs to have their OWN sign up form for the sport they wish to play, please do not add siblings onto 1 form. If your child is signing up for more than 1 sport, they need

Adjustments to the varsity roster would only happen should there be a shortage of 7/8 students to fill the team; in which case 6th graders may be included. In the event the varsity roster is filled appropriately, 6th graders are not placed on a varsity team. In the event that there is not enough interest to form a JV team, there is simply not a JV team this season.

<u>Gospel Reading</u>

John 2:13-25

Jesus drives out the moneychangers from the Temple and says that he will destroy the temple and raise it up again.

Family Connection *From Loyola Press

Today's Gospel invites us to reflect upon our worship of God. For Jesus and his Jewish contemporaries, the Temple was an important, holy place where they gathered to worship God. The Christian understanding of worship was transformed in light of Jesus' Resurrection. In the Christian understanding, God is worshiped in a person, the person of Jesus Christ. As we read in today's Gospel, Jesus is himself the Temple that will be destroyed, but in three days God will raise him up again.

As you gather as a family, talk about places and times when you have experienced God's presence. After his Resurrection, Jesus' disciples understood that Jesus was present with them as they gathered to pray and especially when they gathered to share a meal. Read together today's Gospel, John 2:13-25. Jesus teaches us in today's Gospel that he is God's presence with us. Thank God for Jesus' presence with us, especially in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.
