



## BISON FUND

Beginning January 1, 2020 parents can visit the Bison Fund website @ www.bisonfund.com to complete a scholarship pre-application for the 2020-21 school year. The pre-application form is only for families NEW to BISON. Current families will receive an email with a link to complete the requalification process in February 2020.

The pre-application deadline is this Friday, February 28, 2020. All pre-applications will be entered into a lottery drawing in early March. If families are drawn in the lottery, they will receive an e-mail with instructions on how to proceed with the application. We will also notify families that are not selected and place them on the waiting list.

Please note, the scholarship amounts vary depending on the family's income, household size, and the school's tuition cost. The maximum award will remain at \$2100 per family for the 2020-21 school year. Families will be expected to contribute partial tuition towards their child's education.




