KITCHEN NEWS

Welcome back SME students, teachers, and staff! As summer ends and school begins, we look forward to preparing tasty and nutritious lunches for each of you. We have created a menu that includes many favorites, and hope to introduce some new, exciting entrees as the season moves forward. In addition to the main entrée, we have five alternate lunch choices to choose from, all posted on-line for you to view. All lunches include milk, protein, grain, choice of two vegetables, and a fruit. Students must choose, at minimum, 3 of the 5 offered components in order for a lunch to be complete. We purchase fresh fruits and vegetables weekly, and try to prepare lunches that are as close to scratch as possible. We rely on quality frozen vegetables and fruit products, and limit the amount of canned ingredients used.

Our snack selection offers 'reduced fat,' 'whole grain,' and 'baked' items that are within the government guidelines for snack purchases. Our student lunches are \$3, and may be paid for using cash or check. You may prepay for one lunch, or several. Adult lunches are \$4.25, tax included. Fresh skim milk, fat free chocolate (flavored milk available to K-8 only per government program guidelines), and bottled water are also for sale daily. Ala carte Milk is \$0.50, and water is \$0.50 for 8 oz., \$1 for 16.9 oz. You may prepay for milk as you would for lunches, using cash or check.

Joining our after school care program can happen at any time as needed during the year.
	Attendance Policy	Please review this important policy in our 19-20 handbook which will be distributed in the first weeks of school and is expected to be read & the last page signed off on and returned.
	Back to School Night	Thursday, September 26th. Harvest Homecoming & Meet the Teacher Night. 6-7:30pm.
	Birthdays	We encourage you to celebrate your childs birthday through our cafeteria. Our kitchen offers a variety of snack options and order forms are available on our website, with different price point options noted. Orders should be submitted a week prior to the date which you would like to celebrate.
В	Building Hours	Early drop off is available from 7:00-7:30. Our doors open at 7:30. Students are tardy at 8:10. Pre-K is released at 2:00. Bus & Walker/Parent Pick up dismissal is at 2:15. Any walker/parent pick up not dismissed by 2:30 will await your arrival in our after school care program and regular rates will apply. After school care runs until 6:00.
	Blue Folder Day	Each Wednesday our communication folder comes home with our weekly NewsNote as well as any important flyers/order forms etc Please take a moment to review this information and return the folder empty the following school day for your child.
	Calendar	Our annual calendar is always available on our website. It is also inserted into the front cover of your blue folder which may remain there or be pulled out to post at home. An upcoming calendar section is also on the front page of our NewsNote.
	Cameras	For the safety of everyone on campus our school is monitored with closed circuit cameras. Footage can be reviewed for any reason by administration.
~	Cell Phones	Students are not allowed to use cell phones during the school day, and they must be turned into their homeroom teacher each morning. In the event of an emergency students may be permitted to utilize the phone in the office. Forgotten homework, athletic equipment/P.E. clothes or musical instruments do not constitute as an emergency.
C	Christian Witness	Each month one student per class is chosen to receive the Christian Witness Award. This award is in recognition of a student who has embodied our vision of being " a visible example of Gospel living". Students are not aware of their receipt prior to their name being called however parents are notified and invited to celebrate Mass with us.
	Class Parties	Many of our classrooms are Peanut/Tree Nut safe. This means there are to be no home baked goods brought into the classroom. Any food treats must be prepackaged and indicate that they are safe. This includes any/all candy for holiday parties. All items will be checked and approved by the nurse &/or office staff before being allowed to go to the classroom.
	Clubs	We offer a variety of different clubs which will be indicated during morning announcements and in our weekly NewsNote.
	Dances	Dances are open to our middle school students (gr 6-8) & area catholic schools only. Watch for flyers & information in the NewsNote.

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D	Drop-Off Procedures	If you are dropping your child off in the morning for school please use the following protocol in an effort to keep EVERYONE safe in the parking lot: #1 as you come onto the property continue ALL THE WAY DOWN the drive and pull into the parking lot near the church (just beyond the recycle bins). #2 The section of parking lot closest to the school is ONE WAY and is used for EXITING only! #3 If you are 'dropping & dashing' feel free to drive around the perimeter of the lot and pull up in front of the school to allow your child to exit your vehicle without needing to walk through the parking lot. This is EXACTLY what the district buses will be doing, please use caution, and the same rules that apply on the street apply in our lot: DO NOT pass a bus with its red flashing lights engaged. #4 If you have ANY need to leave the drivers seat you MUST park in a regular spot and do what you need to do/walk your child(ren) to the door or PC for Pre-K drop off. 	Early Dismissal Days	Any/All early dismissal dates are indicated on the annual calendar. Cheektowaga & Alden districts DO NOT provide busing on early dismissal days.
	Faculty & Staff	A complete listing of SME faculty & staff can be found on the SME website.
\mathbf{F}	FAST Club	After school care (FAST Club) is available to all students pre-k through grade 8. Registration forms were in your school registration packet, and are always available on our website or in the main office.

Letter to Parents for School Meal Programs

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. St. Mary's Elementary offers healthy meals every school day. Lunch costs \$3.00. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Beginning July 1, 2019, students in New York State that are approved for reduced price meals will receive breakfast and lunch meals at no charge.

- DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. Complete the application to apply for free or reduced price meals. Use
 one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so
 be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to St. Mary's Elementary, 2 St. Mary's on the Hill, Lancaster, NY 14086.
- 2. WHO CAN GET FREE MEALS? All children in households receiving benefits from SNAP, the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations or TANF, can get free meals regardless of your income. Categorical eligibility for free meal benefits is extended to all children in a household when the application lists an Assistance Program's case number for any household member. Also, your children can get free meals if your household's gross income is within the free limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. It must include the signature of an adult household member and the last four digits of that adult's social security number, or check the box if the adult does not have a social security number. An application for free and reduced price benefits cannot be approved unless complete eligibility information is submitted, as indicated on the application and in the instructions. Contact your local Department of Social Services for your SNAP or TANF case number or complete the income portion of the application. No application is necessary if the household was notified by the SFA their children have been directly certified, the household should contact the school.

Reporting Changes: The benefits that you are approved for at the time of application are effective for the entire school year and up to 30 operating days into the new school year (or until a new eligibility determination is made, whichever comes first). You no longer need to report changes for an increase in income or decrease in household size, or if you no longer receive SNAP.

Income Exclusions: The value of any child care provided or arranged, or any amount received as payment for such child care or reimbursement for costs incurred for such care under the Child Care Development (Block Grant) Fund should not be considered as income for this program.

Reduced Price Eligible Students: Beginning July 1, 2019, students in New York State that are approved for reduced price meals will receive breakfast and lunch meals at no charge.

In the operation of child feeding programs, no child will be discriminated against because of race, sex, color, national origin, age or disability

Meal Service to Children With Disabilities: Federal regulations require schools and institutions to serve meals at no extra charge to children with a disability which may restrict their diet. A student with a disability is defined in 7CFR Part 15b.3 of Federal regulations, as one who has a physical or mental impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities of such individual, a record of such an impairment or being regarded as having such an impairment. Major life activities include but are not limited to: functions such as caring for one's self, performing manual tasks, seeing, hearing, eating, sleeping, walking, standing, lifting, bending, speaking, breathing, learning, reading, concentrating, thinking, communicating, and working. You must request meal modifications from the school and provide the school with medical statement from a State licensed healthcare professional. If you believe your child needs substitutions because of a disability, please get in touch with us for further information, as there is specific information that the medical statement must contain.

Confidentiality: The United States Department of Agriculture has approved the release of students names and eligibility status, without parent/guardian consent, to persons directly connected with the administration or enforcement of federal education programs such as Title I and the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), which are United States Department of Education programs used to determine areas such as the allocation of funds to schools, to evaluate socioeconomic status of the school's attendance area, and to assess educational progress. Information may also be released to State health or State education programs administered by the State agency or local education agency, provided the State or local education agency administers the program, and federal State or local nutrition programs similar to the National School Lunch Program. Additionally, all information contained in the free and reduced price application may be released to persons directly connected with the administration or enforcement of programs authorized under the National School Lunch Act (NSLA) or Child Nutrition Act (CNA); including the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs, the Special Milk Program, the Child and Adult Care Food Program, Summer Food Service

FREE AND REDUCED PRICE MEAL APPLICATION FACT SHEET

When filling out the application form, please pay careful attention to these helpful hints.

SNAP/TANF/FDPIR case number: This must be the <u>complete</u> valid case number supplied to you by the agency including all numbers <u>and</u> letters, for example, E123456, or whatever combination is used in your county. Refer to a letter you received from your local Department of Social Services for your case number or contact them for your number.

Foster Child: A child who is living with a family but who is under the legal care of the welfare agency or court may be listed on your family application. List the child's "personal use" income. This includes only those funds provided by the agency which are identified for the personal use of the child, such as personal spending allowances, money received by his/her family, or from a job. Funds provided for housing, food and care, medical, and therapeutic needs are not considered income to the foster child. Write "0" if the child has no personal use income.

Household: A group of related or non-related people who are living in one house and share income and expenses.

Adult Family Members: All related and non-related people who are 21 years of age and older living in your house.

<u>Financially Independent:</u> A person is financially independent and a separate economic unit/household when his or her earnings and expenses are not shared by the family/household. Separate economic units in the same residence are characterized by prorating expenses and by economic independence from one another.

<u>Current Gross Income</u>: Money earned or received at the present time by each member of your household <u>before deductions</u>. Examples of deductions are federal tax, State tax, and Social Security deductions. If you have more than one job, you must list the income from all jobs. If you receive income from more than one source (wage, alimony, child support, etc.), you must list the income from all sources. Only farmers, self-employed workers, migrant workers, and other seasonal employees may use their income for the past 12 months reported from their 1040 Tax Forms.

Examples of gross income are:

- Wages, salaries, tips, commissions, or income from self-employment
- Net farm income gross sales minus expenses only not losses
- Pensions, annuities, or other retirement income including Social Security retirement benefits
- Unemployment compensation
- Welfare payments (does not include value of SNAP)
- Public Assistance payments
- Adoption assistance

- Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or Social Security Survivor's Benefits
- Alimony or child support payments
- Disability benefits, including workman's compensation
- Veteran's subsistence benefits
- Interest or dividend income
- Cash withdrawn from savings, investments, trusts, and other resources which would be available to pay for a child's meals
- · Other cash income

Income Exclusions: The value of any child care provided or arranged, or any amount received as payment for such child care or reimbursement for costs incurred for such care under the Child Care Development (Block Grant) Fund should not be considered as income for this program.
