## FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK...

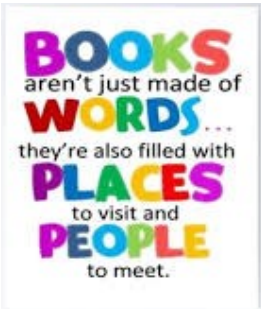
Happy Wednesday!

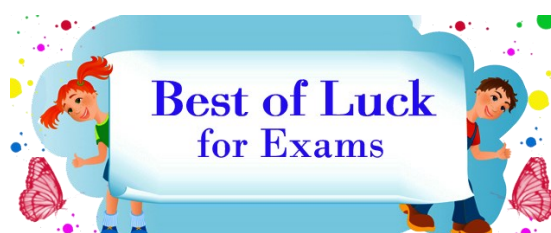

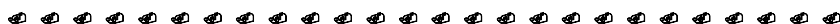

## General Information

**Registration:** Class sizes are limited, therefore, classes will be filled on a first come, first served basis.

We reserve the right to cancel a class due to insufficient registrations.

Registration for the Summer Theatre Workshop will take place during auditions. See below for additional information.

The groups Pre K, 1, 2, 3, 4, K-3, 4-6, 5-6, etc., represent the grades students have completed during the 2020-2021 school year.

**Location of Classes:** All classes will be held at the Lancaster Youth Bureau, 200 Oxford Ave., except for the Summer Theatre Workshop and academies.

**Fees:** Fees vary - see individual class descriptions for specific fees. Town of Lancaster or Lancaster/Depew School District resident fees are different from non-resident fees. **NO CASH PAYMENTS WILL BE ACCEPTED.**

**Checks/money orders should be payable to: TOWN OF LANCASTER.**

**Refunds:** No refunds will be given after June 25<sup>th</sup>, or unless class is cancelled

**Safety:** No Parents or other family members will be allowed in the building. Personnel from the Town of Lancaster Youth Bureau are not responsible for any children dropped off early, or picked up late.

**Based on current Erie County Health Department Safety Guidelines:** Staff and students are required to wear masks. Before entering building each child will have their temperature checked and be asked required screening questions, and will have their hands sanitized. Children will be socially distanced at desks/tables.

**Meals:** No food will be permitted in classrooms.

**Supplies:** Each child must bring their own pencils or pens. Art Class supplies will be provided.

**Transportation:** You must provide your own transportation.

## **Child and Babysitting Safety Course**

**July 7th & Aug. 16th**

This Centers for CPR (C4CPR) course teaches the skills necessary to care for young children. This program is designed for youth ages 11 and up. Course highlights include first aid, safety and injury prevention, care giving & leadership skills, and teaching constructive play time activities. ***\$35 fee for residents / \$45 for non-residents.***

## **Studio in Art Classes**

**July 13th through August 12th**

*\$25 fee for residents / \$35 for non-residents for each art class.*

It is recommended that students bring an art smock or old T-shirt with them to class for the 5 week art classes, meeting once a week for an hour. An art show at the end of the summer will feature selected student art work.

***Line & Colors & Shapes-Oh my...*** Even the smallest hands can create the most amazing artwork. Young artists will be introduced to art basics through this 5 week unit. Students will use a variety of mediums (paints, oil pastels and model magic) to create both 2-D and 3-D masterpieces. Art smock recommended daily.

***\*This class is for those entering Kindergarten in September.***

***“New” It’s Raining Cats and Dogs*** – This class is for the animal lover... Young artists will create a variety of dog and cat themed projects. Students will use a variety of mediums and techniques to complete their animal creations.

A2      K-3      Tuesdays      9:00 - 10:00

***“New” It’s Fishy*** – Let’s take the plunge this summer and learn about things found in the ocean – like puffer fish, jelly fish and star fish. Students will use a variety of mediums to create some amazing “fishy” art.

A3      K-3      Thursdays      9:00 - 10:00

***“New” Sweet Treats*** – Young artists will create some “sweet” and realistic looking art forms. Students will use a variety of mediums and techniques to complete their 2-D and 3-D creations.

A4      K-3      Thursdays      10:10 - 11:10

***“New” Mini Sculptures*** – In this class students will use a variety of art materials and build sculptures. Young artists and architects will learn the basics in creating and thinking 3-dimensionally. Students will use glue, scissors and paint to create some miniature free standing sculptures. Students are asked to bring assorted cardboard tubes and a cardboard box to the first class.

***Watercolor Painting*** - This class is for the serious artist. Students will be introduced to a variety of techniques using watercolor paints. Weekly lessons will build upon how to handle the medium, concepts and skills. The class is geared toward the older child who expresses an interest and talent in the arts. Some outside work will be required as to allow for more painting during class time!
