RAISERIGHT

Reminder: Families earn 100% of rebates up to \$250 and an 80/20 split thereafter.

About the process:

RaiseRight credits are processed quarterly: March, June, September, and December. Mrs. Jezuit applies credits to tuition accounts based on the reports generated and received from RaiseRight. The RaiseRight office is not able to look into individual tuition accounts. If you (or a family member) is purchasing cards to help reduce your tuition you/ they must designate the recipient family when opening an online account or by indicating the family name on paper order forms. Without this information the RaiseRight office has no way of knowing where to assign credits.

Spring Sports

All students who wish to participate in school sports **MUST HAVE** a valid NYS Physical on file in the Health Office. Please hand these in ASAP to avoid delays in your child participating in practices/games.

Always Changing and Growing-Up

All students in the 5th Grade class will have an opportunity to watch the Always Changing and Growing-Up Puberty videos in class this month. Information and permission slips have already gone home.

This important information provides students in this age range with the appropriate tools and resources to navigate the changes that will or already have begun within their bodies. As well as give them the opportunity to ask questions they may have or that can arise from watching the videos.

Parents may view the videos online prior to the class. Feel free to contact me via email if you would like the link.

RSV = Respiratory Syncytial Virus

What is it: A respiratory virus with symptoms similar to the common cold.

How it's spread: From contact or droplets (saliva or mucus) of infected individuals. Ex: coughing or sneezing. These droplets then are transferred via air or surfaces to others through the mouth, nose, and eyes.

Symptoms:

- Runny nose Decrease in appetite
- Coughing Sneezing
- Fever Wheezing

Prevention:

Common **Childhood Viruses**

- Stay home when sick. Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue or your shirt sleeve, not your hands.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Avoid touching your face with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with others, such as kissing, shaking hands, and sharing cups and eating utensils.
- Clean frequently touched surfaces such as doorknobs and mobile devices.







Recruitment FAQs

What can I expect to do as a Girl Scout?

Girl Scouts is all about fun, friendship and new adventures. You will make friends, challenge yourself, write your own story, and learn how to change the world for the better. Some Girl Scouts love to camp, some love to build things, some love to read, some love to learn, and so much more - the great thing is they get to do it with new friends!

What is the time commitment?

Most girls spend a few hours (3-4) every month working on badge projects and attending troop meetings/events.

What is the financial commitment?

The annual dues to join Girl Scouts is \$25. There may also be small fees for activities and troop dues throughout the year. We want every girl to participate and the organization is deeply committed to ensuring that all girls are able to participate. Financial assistance is available to families in need. If you join April 1st through extended year program, the cost will be \$35 for your first year.

Who can be a Girl Scout?

Girls in Kindergarten through grade 12 can join Girl Scouts. Girls progress through programming levels and each level offers challenges and opportunities for girls to learn and achieve.

Is it necessary to be part of a troop?

Not all Girl Scouts choose to be part of a troop. Some instead choose to be Juliettes, independent Girl Scouts who do not belong to a specific troop but do participate in activities, badge programs, camp, and cookie selling based on their interests.

How do I join?

Do I get to sell Girl Scout cookies?

Yes! You can be part of the largest girl-led business in the United States. You'll learn five important skills: goal setting, decision making, money management, people skills, and business ethics.
