## Illnesses

Please view the accompanying handout "I need to stay Home If...". This handout will provide you with the guidelines necessary to help prevent the spread of illnesses.

Also, please note that any student who tests positive for Covid must remain out of school until 24hours fever free without the aid of Motrin/Tylenol, and it is recommended they mask for 5 days following return to school.

We can minimize illness by:

1-Getting plenty of rest

2- Eating a balanced diet

3- Drinking more water

4- Avoiding crowded areas

5- Covering coughs/sneezes

6- Washing hands frequently or using sanitizer

7-Getting your annual Flu vaccine

# Safe Snacks

When Sending in snacks to share with the classroom for Holiday or birthday Celebrations please be sure they come from the safe snack list. This ensures all students may safely participate in the celebration and no one is excluded due to allergies beyond their control.

If you have ideas for a snack to be added to the list please email me and I will research the ingredients and manufacturer to ensure it is safe and potentially add it to the list!

#### Attention all parents/guardians:

Please note that if your child is not feeling well at home we ask you to use your best judgment when determining whether or not to send them to school. Illness can and will spread rapidly among younger students and it is our goal here at SME to take precautions to minimize the instances of these illnesses.

Your student MUST STAY HOME if any of the below items apply. This also applies anytime a student is sent home from the Health Office.

HEALTH ADVISORY: Updated recommendations on when to stay home and when to go back to normal activities after respiratory illnesses including COVID-19, influenza, and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) – Non-Healthcare Settings

Following the <u>updated CDC recommendations</u>, the NYSDOH is revising its guidance for when to stay home and when individuals can return to normal activities after respiratory infections including COVID-19, influenza, and RSV. This <u>infographic</u> from the CDC is helpful in simply illustrating this respiratory guidance. Please feel free to post in clinical spaces so staff and patients can easily understand this approach for viral respiratory diseases.

- Individuals should stay home and away from others, including people they live with who
  are not sick, if they have respiratory virus symptoms that are not better explained by
  another cause. These symptoms can include fever, chills, fatigue, cough, runny nose,
  and headache.
- Individuals can go back to normal activities when, for at least 24 hours, both of the following are true:
  - o Symptoms are getting better overall, and
  - o They no longer have a fever without the use of fever-reducing medication.
- When going back to normal activities, individuals should take added precautions over the next 5 days, including taking additional <u>steps for cleaner air</u>, <u>hygiene</u>, <u>masks</u>, <u>physical distancing</u>, and <u>testing</u> when they will be around other people, especially older adults, young children, and those with weakened immune systems. Children under age 2 should never wear a mask. Healthcare providers should discuss with their patients about how long a child under 2 should stay home.
- Keep in mind that people may still be able to spread the virus that made them sick, even
  if they are feeling better, so it is important to take extra precautions after resuming
  normal activities.

• If individuals develop a fever or start to feel worse, they should stay home and away from others again. They should use the same criteria for returning to normal activities as when they first had symptoms and take added precautions over the next 5 days.

These changes described above **DO NOT** pertain to individuals working in healthcare settings. Healthcare facilities should continue to follow the CDC's Interim Guidance for Managing Healthcare Personnel with SARS-CoV-2 Infection or Exposure to SARS-CoV-2 | CDC and Strategies to Mitigate Healthcare Personnel Staffing Shortages. Transition from conventional to contingency to crisis staffing strategies should be based on ability to provide essential services, as determined by the facility. Also
